### **On the Third Day**

Dear People of God:

On the “third day” He rose again! Death doesn’t have the last word, but there is no avoiding the cross. We do have to experience Good Friday before we can experience Easter. Life is a constant process of death and resurrection, of picking up our cross daily and following Jesus. I pray that this holy season of Lent has been a fruitful time for you to do some “holy house cleaning,” through daily prayer, study, fasting, and reflecting on God’s Holy Scriptures.

The Crucified Life has been an excellent Lenten Study and devotional guide for shining God’s light on areas of our lives that need healing. We have been engaging a weekly theme based on Jesus’ seven last words from the cross: Forgiveness, Salvation, Relationship, Distress, Abandonment, Reunion, and Triumph.

We are so excited to be hosting The Rev. Charlie Holt, author of *The Crucified Life*, *The Resurrected Life*, and *The Spirit-filled Life*, Wednesday, April 3<sup>rd</sup> as our Lenten Speaker. I hope that you, and your family and friends, will make a special effort to come and hear Charlie speak on the powerful topic of Abandonment.

Also, Jonathan McComb will be our final Lenten Speaker on Wednesday, April 10th. I am so grateful to Jonathan for his willingness to share with us his story of life, faith, and survival. It will be a holy time of remembering and healing for our community who in many ways shared in tragic floods of Wimberley in May of 2015.

The Women’s Retreat at Mustang Island Conference Center will be held April 12-13, and then Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday, April 14<sup>th</sup>, Wednesday Eucharist at 5:30, with Stations of the Cross following, Maundy Thursday services at 5:30, and Good Friday Services, 7am Eucharist from Reserve Sacrament, and the Main Service at Noon. We will have our regular Easter Services at 8:00 and 10:30 with Easter Egg Hunt following the 10:30 service. Please note: no breakfast, no Sunday School, and no 5:30 service on Easter Sunday.

We will be welcoming Bishop Jennifer Brooke-Davidson on Sunday, April 28<sup>th</sup> for Confirmation Sunday. Bishop Jennifer has roots at St. James and Good Shepherd and will be returning home to preside over a wonderful new group of people who are being confirmed and received. Please be sure to come out and meet the Bishop and show her the amazing life of this parish.

That’s a lot of Resurrection and New Life for one month!


## Wednesday Evenings - New Class begins after Easter

### The Christian Life Series: Lent - *The Crucified Life*


**Led by Rev. Milton Black and Rev. Philip May**




### Episcopal 101: Foundations for Mature Faith


We will also have quiz night where we will engage the themes of both Lent and Easter, as well as take home some "sweet" prizes.


## Children's Ministry During Lent

**Finding God in Today's Turbulence**



Dr. Erika Moore is Academic Dean at Trinity School for Ministry in Ambridge, Pa. where she also serves as Professor of Biblical Studies and Hebrew and as Director of the STM (Masters in Sacred Theology) program. She studied at Wheaton College for her B.A. and took her MAR and PhD from Westminster Theological Seminary, Philadelphia, in Hermeneutics and Biblical Studies.
