



From the Rector



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I want to take a moment to bring you up to speed on the transition taking place in our music program. We have been actively searching for a new Director of Music/ Organist/Choir Director since early May. We have received some interest but not a lot; nothing to get excited about. This position is a challenging position to fill both because of its central role in the life of our worship and the fact that there just aren't that many qualified candidates available.

We are not looking to just fill a position, but to find the right person for the Church of the Good Shepherd. A person called to love and serve God's people here in Corpus Christi. This person needs to be both technically proficient as well as have the right personality and leadership skills to build up our music program for all ages and to serve God's people in Christ. We are confident that we have an excellent opportunity for the right person.

Our position is posted nationally on the Association of Anglican Musicians website, as well as other diocesan websites. Because of the nature of the position and the difficulty in discerning the right fit, we are putting a high priority on networking regionally with people for whom we know and trust; other clergy and Music Ministers who are affiliated with churches and university programs around the state. We feel this is a better use of our time and resources and is more likely to yield a person who is right for us.
