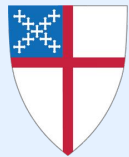

A Message from the Senior Warden

Greetings from your Senior Warden!

This past January we temporarily changed our election process as a response to the pandemic. Instead of presenting 12 candidates from which we would elect 6 at our Annual Parish Meeting, we presented a slate of 6 that was approved by acclamation. This change was intended for one year only, but we agreed to investigate whether a permanent change to our election method was warranted. I am writing you to give you the outcome of the Vestry's thorough examination of that issue. The short answer is that we will return to proposing 12 candidates each year for election.

Late last year we formed a Vestry Election Process Committee consisting of Gregg Robertson, Leslie Peart, and myself. The Committee was tasked with gathering information to fairly compare the traditional election process to the slate election process. We compiled an extensive list of "pros" and "cons" for each option, recognizing that there are substantial strengths and weaknesses on both sides. We contacted other churches of similar size to inquire about their own election processes, and found that a pretty even amount of both election methods are being used. We circulated a survey to Church members to gauge their support of one election method over the other. We found that our Church is split on this election issue. The Committee ultimately found value in both election methods, and concluded that either process would be acceptable. We felt it simply came down to which method best suits the style of our Parish.

The Committee presented a written report of its findings to the Vestry at its August meeting. The Vestry had open and honest discussions at its next two monthly meetings. We weighed the "pros" and "cons" and identified what was most influential to each of us. In the end, a majority of the Vestry wanted to keep the traditional election process in place.

I have heard from parishioners that are passionate on both sides of this election issue over the last several months. As I told the Vestry, my biggest concern was that the outcome of this process would result in division no matter what was decided. I am pleased to report that as Vestry members made their opinions known on this matter, I repeatedly sensed a voice of consensus. We all seemed to appreciate and respect opposing viewpoints, and would unify behind wherever this journey led us. I pray that each of you will feel similarly and trust that we made the best decision based on all of the information gathered.

I cannot express enough thanks to Gregg and Leslie for serving with me on the Vestry Election Process Committee. Their thoughtfulness and insight were vital in putting our written report together. I also need to thank the entire Vestry for their open and kind support throughout this process.

We are currently seeking candidates for the upcoming Vestry election in January. If you are interested in serving or if you want to recommend someone else to serve on Vestry, please contact me. We would love to hear from you.

Seeking Vestry Nominees

The Nominating Committee of the Vestry is actively seeking qualified candidates who are interested in being considered for nomination to the Vestry.

The Vestry is a board of lay leaders in the Church who have been elected by the congregation to govern the parish. They oversee all aspects of the Church's operations, including the finances, the property and the mission of the Church. The Vestry consists of 18 members who have demonstrated leadership, commitment and service to the Church, and who actively dedicate themselves to the mission of the Church. Each member brings their own unique experience, knowledge and expertise from various sectors of the community, benefiting the church immeasurably. Six new members are elected every year for a three-year term, as six rotate off the Vestry having completed their term. Elections are held annually at the Parish Meeting in January.

Vestry Qualifications

- **At least 18 years of age**
- **A baptized and confirmed member of Good Shepherd**
- **Regularly participate in worship and parish events**
- **Seeking to grow in faith in Jesus**
- **Making a regular financial commitment to the Church**
- **Dedicated to the mission of Christ in the world**
