Annual Address from the Rector

Grace to you and Peace, from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

As we reflect on last year and look forward to 2023, I give thanks to God, for clearly His hand has been upon our church this past year. The theme we began the year with was "the Lord is near you, on your lips and in your heart." Well, the Lord has been very near to us indeed. We have come out of the pandemic extremely well. We continue to experience year over year growth in all age groups, especially young families, and children. Last year

we welcomed into our fellowship 62 adults and 34 children. That doesn't include those who wish to remain anonymous. You can't help noticing the amazing number of young children and families in our midst.

God is blessing the Good Shepherd in so many ways. I am pleased that we were able to return to our regular schedule of programs this past year. We still have work to do in restarting some of our committees, as well as reenforcing some of our lay ministries who need additional people. Let us know if you would like to serve as an usher, greeter, lay reader, acolyte, altar guild, or choir member. There is a place for you here to exercise your gifts. We have so much to celebrate, and to be thankful for, and you are a big part of what makes Good Shepherd such a special place. It is all about the people, the warm hospitality, and a faithful community.

This coming year our theme will be taken from Psalm 95:1, "Come let us Sing to the Lord." These are words of praise put to music in the familiar canticle known as the Venite. You know it well. "Come let us sing to the Lord; let us shout for joy to the Rock of our salvation. Let us come before his presence with thanksgiving and raise a loud shout to Him with psalms." "Come let us Sing to the Lord, for we are the people of His pasture and the sheep of His hand. Oh, that today we would harken to His voice." Jesus is our Good Shepherd who is leading us, providing for us, and protecting us. We sing to the Lord our praise and thanksgiving for He is with us to deliver us. It is the message of salvation which the world is dying to hear. Come let us sing to the Lord!

There is a lot of excitement going on in our music ministries under the direction of Dr. Mi Ou Lee. Mi Ou has brought our Adult Choir back to support us in our worship. She has hired Joyce Wilcox to lead our bell choir, and what an amazing job Mi Ou done with our children's choir. In addition to everything Mi Ou is doing, she has been heavily engaged in the purchase of a wonderful new pipe organ for our church. With the help of our consultant, we have

contracted to have a beautiful new pipe organ built by the reputable Schoenstein & Co. of Benicia, CA. Established in 1877, Schoenstein & Co. is the oldest and largest organ builder in the western United States with a long list of notable projects, including St. Martin's Episcopal Church in Houston and the Mormon Tabernacle Choir Organ in Salt Lake City.

Our new organ will be designed and built specifically for our worship space and will include over 2000 pipes and 44 ranks with beautiful casework and exposed pipes in the chancel and in the balcony. It will be built this year and installed by the summer of 2024. Our existing organ, which has served our church beautifully for over 70 years, will be removed in January 2024. The organ chamber will be prepared for our new organ in February and March. The new Schoenstein organ will be installed in April and May of 2024, and then tuned in June 2024. That means we will be without an organ from January through June of 2024.

Today we are launching our "Sing to the Lord" campaign to fund the balance of \$1 million needed for the new organ. We hope to conclude this effort by the end of May. I want to thank our committee chairs Mary Clark, Karen Bonner, and Alex Kirkland for their hard work and dedication to this project. We welcome your generous participation in this exciting project that will be a blessing to this community for generations to come. Come let us Sing to the Lord!



On February 19th we will have a very special guest preacher, The Rt. Rev. Pons Ozelle from the Nebbi Diocese of the Church of Uganda. Please join us in giving Bishop Pons a warm welcome. Rev. Ozelle gave his life to the Lord in 1993 at the age of 24. He was ordained a deacon in 2000 and then made a priest in 2001. He has served as Diocesan Secretary and Diocesan Administrator of Nebbi Diocese, Archdeacon of two Archdeaconries, parish priest, and Chaplain of several schools. Rev. Ozelle has also served with World Vision, taught at Uganda College of Commerce and Paidha Primary Teachers' Training College, and Chaired the Boards of Governors for Uringi Secondary School and Pakwach Secondary School. Rev. Ozelle is married to Edna Owila, who teaches at Uringi Secondary School, and God has blessed them with four children.
