A Message from the Rector

Dear Good Shepherd Family,

First, I want you to know how much I miss you and look forward to being with you soon. My time away was planned long before my diagnosis of Multiple Myeloma in January. I am certain that God knew I would need the time to focus on this new surprise. My sabbatical was always about renewing my spiritual, mental, and physical health, and that it has been. However, our big focus has been on weekly treatments, doctor visits, managing medications, insurance, and just trying to stay on top of it all. It's been busy, different, and a true blessing.

I am so grateful to each of you for your love and prayers and those of so many near and far. I have felt them and know with certainty that your prayers are the reason why I have responded so well to my treatments. In May the doctors were so impressed with my progress that they began making plans for my eventual stem cell transplant, the procedure with the best chance of putting this cancer into remission.

I have been in touch with Gregg Robertson, our Sr. Warden, and our outstanding staff over these months about my progress and the plan to move forward. I will return to the office as scheduled on July 31st and will be in the pulpit August 6th. As much as I would like to hug each of you, unfortunately I am going to have to maintain some social distancing. My immune system is suppressed from the treatments, and I can't afford to catch anything before the transplant.

On Sunday, August 6th we will celebrate and give thanks for a very successful "Sing to the Lord" campaign supporting our wonderful new Schoenstein pipe organ to be installed next year. We are so grateful to all of you who have stepped out in faith to help make this addition a reality.

On August 7th I will be at MD Anderson in Houston to begin the long process of receiving a stem cell transplant. It will keep me out of the office through September. The 1st week requires testing, the 2nd the collection of my stem cells, the 3rd a heavy dose of chemo wiping out my immune system, and the re-introduction of my stem cells to regrow new and hopefully cancer free bone marrow. Then, the focus will be my recovery and isolating until my immune system is restored. The plan is to work remotely in September and return to the office in October.

I can't wait to see you on August 6th. Please keep the prayers coming; they have made all the difference. Pray particularly for a successful stem cell transplant with no setbacks or infections, and ultimately a full remission. Thank you for your amazing love and prayer support.


